Exhibition at the Garden Gallery

9/19 Exhibition on view from 10 -4 Artists are requested to be present for at least an hour that day for self-promotion. There will be a printed schedule so your fans and collectors can plan their visit accordingly.

FCAST artists, you are invited to show your art in The Garden Gallery preview exhibition which will open the day before we go live with our virtual tour!

My back yard is The Garden Gallery which has already had substantial press from Black Hills Fox in a segment of Steve Long's, Along the Way. I will further promote our show via my Facebook and Instagram accounts.

The Garden Gallery is a peaceful oasis that is completely fenced and secure. There are several white fences for hanging 2D work, a selection of easels, and some wall space inside my garage/summer studio. There's plenty of room for 3D throughout the yard as well as a small shaded path that would show sculptures well.

This will be an open-air art viewing experience with CDC, COVID 19 protocol required. Artists who participate must agree to the following:

- Hang your own work. (Consider how easily it can be moved if a sudden hailstorm comes up!)
- Assist with set up, tear down, and clean up. And the possibility of a quick take down into the garage incase of a passing storm!
- Provide refreshments. I'll put together a list ala potluck style, so it won't be a burden on any one person!
- Have your tax ID number on hand incase you make a sale. (This is to cover yourself, just in case!)
- Sign a waiver to release me from all liability. I have 30 years of curatorial experience and can assure you that I will take all reasonable precautions.
- Assist with gallery flow, similar to how businesses are monitoring the number of customers.

I invite anyone interested to come view The Garden Gallery and discuss the logistics. I can show you how traffic flow can be controlled and how we can show your work. I have about 30-40' of white, 6' tall fencing. A small area in my garage can be for push pinning works on paper. For sculptors and ceramic artists, I have garden niches and a little woodsy trail to place art in the leafy shade. I also have about 6 easels and artists can bring their own. There's plenty of room to maintain social distancing for about 10 - 15 people at a time. Traffic flow can be easily managed with one way in and a different way out.
